### **President's Report: Shelly Turner**

- Want to have some sort of virtual option for meeting, possible Zoom or Google Meet
- Supplied Secret Stories to 1st grade classrooms
- Purchased microwave for teacher's lounge, budget \$150
- Purchased Inclusion Brew Crew ice machine, budget \$100
  - Autistic kids create social skills by taking a coffee cart around school every Friday

### **Principal's Report: Mrs. Shannon**

- Winter break coming up for two weeks
- A lot of illnesses going around the school including the flu; make sure kids wash hands

## **Teacher's Report: Miss Oatley**

Kindergarten: Students are writing nonfiction booklets about their "favorite places"- making sure to use labels to teach others. In Reading, students have worked on their partner reading skills- how to be more of a "coach" -giving tips and cheering friends on. Social Studies is all about cultural celebrations and celebrating Hickory Woods diversity.

1st Grade: First grade celebrated 6-7 day on Friday with some fun math activities and crafts. We are finishing our word detectives units in reading and phonics. The kids are now experts on silent e. We are also wrapping up how-to writing.

2nd Grade: Second grade is piloting a different Social Studies curriculum. We are learning about the history of Walled Lake and will create postcards to go with what we learn.

3rd Grade: Reader's Workshop and Writer's Workshop - nonfiction texts. For writing, each student chose a Michigan animal to write about, since social studies is all about Michigan. Math - unit 3 - multi-digit addition and subtraction with regrouping - Also keep practicing multiplication facts. Science - structures of life - Will be doing a fruit dissection soon, to observe seeds. Social Studies - Kicking off our unit on Michigan history.

5th Grade: Students are working hard in math on learning operations with fractions and mixed numbers. They are also learning how to interpret remainders in fraction division problems. In reading, students are learning summarizing and vocabulary strategies to understand nonfiction texts. In writing, they are working on argument essays about whether schools should give kids homework. They are also learning how to pull evidence from published texts to support their arguments. In science, we started our new unit on Living Systems and are reviewing food chains and food webs. Lastly, in social studies, we are studying European explorers. Right before Thanksgiving Break, students also took their reproductive health course. It is a busy time to be a 5th grader!

Media: Spelling Bee is under way and by the last week of December we will know who our 5th Grade Spelling Bee competitors will be and they will have materials to prepare for our building competition.

Caldecott Medal work is being done by 3rd-5th grades and they will vote on their favorites before the American Library Association picks the winner and runner ups.

2nd Grades are focused on non-fiction in Media. Animal Reports using Pebble Go in January and our own writings in February.

Next week is International Hour of Code Week and there are many projects available on the Hour of Code site for kids to explore. All of my grade levels are working on Code.org from our Classlink and learning how games and programs are created.

LEO: Leo will be picked up over our Holiday break. Leo will spend the next month at home getting acclimated to Mrs. Watkin's house before coming to school. He will then be at school part-time until he is able to attend school full time.
